ptimize growing conditions for your houseplants by taking them outside. They will enjoy the heat and humidity. Most varieties will like a shady location, with the exception of flowering plants like hibiscus or jasmine.

se a decorative container of your choice. When in doubt of size, choose a larger one to give the plants plenty of room to grow and more stability to withstand some wind. Choose any upright plant for the center and then add smaller plants around the base. You can choose foliage plants such as ivy or pothos, or flowering plants, such as begonias or anthuriums. The selection is limited only by your imagination.

eam up those plants that are compatible. Keep shade plants with shade plants and sun plants with sun plants. Some plants such as pothos, will tolerate morning sun. Add Green Leaf Plant Food and water well throughout the season.

Some more good suggestions:

park some interest with a cordyline underplanted with stromanthe and variegated (or green) ivy for fantastic color.

ntegrate a ficus tree with begonias, or annual impatiens, and have the foliage up above the base of the blooms.

evelop a fragrant container by using a perfume tree, underplanted with jasmine, to lend a scent to your porch or patio.
